





Five Fruits Can Help Hungry People in Africa

No fruit, by itself, can feed all hungry people. But around the world there are many different fruits and vegetables that can help hungry people. These plants also help farmers make more money.

You may not have heard about these five fruits from Africa:

1. Monkey Orange:

The trees are about the size of an apple or pear tree. They grow in Africa and can feed a lot of people. The farmers there often leave monkey orange trees when they're cutting other trees. The large green or yellow fruit has a sweet taste and is very good for you. You can eat them fresh, make juice or cook them into marmalade. We should plant them everywhere!

2. Ackee:

These trees have many uses, but people don't usually eat the fruit. They make soap from it and use the wood to build houses. The fruit skin can make you ill or even kill you, but the leaves are good food for sheep and goats. If we cook the fruit, we can eat it like a vegetable with meat. It's very good for us, but we have to be careful to eat the right parts.

3. Wild Coffee:

The world's favourite coffee is called arabica. People grow the low arabica plants in many places, but it's only a wild plant under the trees in mountain forests. People enjoy coffee as a drink, and this coffee is great! So farmers there are learning to pick and dry the wild coffee beans. They can sell coffee to make money, so they look after the forests, too.

4. Tsamma Melon:

This is a wild plant in the Kalahari Desert and the fruit can hold a large amount of water. Not all tsamma melons taste the same. One kind is sweet and people eat it like watermelon. Another kind isn't so sweet and it's hard to chew. People cook it to eat. The tsamma can grow where there is very little water, and people can eat it if they have no water to drink.

5. Safou:

Tall safou trees grow in wet forests in central Africa. Safou is also called "butter fruit" because of its taste. People eat it fresh as a fruit and also cook it in water or in the oven. It makes a good snack or a whole meal. The best thing about safou is the tree. It can grow in the forest with other trees. So, people don't have to cut the forest to plant food.
