





## <u>Time</u>

#### by Angelos Romessis, aged 11

There are 60 seconds in a minute, 60 minutes in an hour, 24 hours in a day, 7 days in a week and 52 weeks in a year. There are also 365 days in a year. But 7 x 52 = 364, not 365. Where is the missing day?



The Earth goes round the Sun.

The answer is that there aren't exactly 52 weeks in a year. That's why January 1<sup>st</sup> is sometimes on a Monday, sometimes on a Tuesday, sometimes on a Wednesday, etc. If there were exactly 52 weeks in a year, it would always be on the same day!

Also, there aren't always 365 days in a year. A 'year' is the time it takes for the Earth to go round the Sun. It actually takes about 365.25 days to go round the Sun. Because of this, every 4 years we have a 'leap year'. This is when there are 366 days in a year. How do we get an extra day? It's easy! Usually, February only has 28 days, but in a leap year we also have February 29th.


