

What's the difference between a boat and a ship? A ship is a very large boat.

In English, they use some strange words to talk about boats and ships. For example, if you sleep on a boat, you don't sleep in a bedroom. You sleep



in a 'cabin'. And your bed's not called a bed. It's called a 'berth'. Also, we don't talk about left and right with boats. We say 'port' for left and 'starboard' for right. And we don't say front and back either! The front of the boat is the 'bow', and the back of the boat is the 'stern'.

Some people, when they talk about boats and ships, don't say 'it'. They say 'she'. For example, they might say 'She's a beautiful ship, isn't she?'

There are lots of different types of boat. Container ships, for example, carry very big boxes. Cruise ships take people on holiday to different places. In the photo, there's a very large cruise ship, and some smaller sailing boats.




